



We are in a difficult situation here as these courses are expensive. For this reason, we have created a scholarship endowment fund for higher education to help us meet these expenses. An average cost of College Fee, Inclusive of Mess, Hostel, and Miscellaneous fees is Rs. 1,25,000 approximately for a child for a year.

VISIT OF THE OFFICER- DIRECTORATE OF SOCIAL WELFARE



Mrs. S. Shanthy, Asst. Accounts Officer from the Directorate of Social Welfare, Chennai, visited the Home for inspection. She went through the registers, finances, and the physical facilities of the organization. She interacted with the residents and was impressed with the facilities.

VISIT OF DISTRICT LEVEL INSPECTION COMMITTEE



The District Level Inspection Committee (DLIC), which includes a member from the District Child Welfare Committee, the District Child Protection Unit, and a district child counsellor, visits the child care institution every three months for an inspection. The committee reviews the registers of the child care institution and the records of the children. They also inspect the facility to ensure that it complies with the standards set by the Juvenile Justice Act of Tamil Nadu. The last DLIC was conducted in July 2025. The children's representatives were present during the inspection. Rectification was made for the suggestions given by the committee.

VISIT OF THE GOVERNMENT OFFICERS

Mr. Palaniswamy, the Food Safety Officer from the Vellore Corporation, K.V. Kuppam & Katpadi Block, conducted an inspection at the Home. He examined the kitchen for food preparation and storage, as well as the general stores, to ensure that food safety and hygiene standards were being met for the children, in accordance with FSSAI regulations. Following his visit, the Home received certification from the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India.

Mr. Krishnamurthy, Assistant Inspector of Labour, visited the organization to ensure compliance with the Minimum Wages Act and to verify whether the employees had any grievances. He also checked if the provident funds and other employee benefits were being properly maintained. He was satisfied with the way the relevant records were kept.

FIRE SAFETY AWARENESS PROGRAMME



The personnel from the Vellore District Fire and Rescue Service conducted a fire safety awareness program for both staff and residents. They covered the causes of fire, safety measures, and provided hands-on training with fire extinguishers. Wardens and cooks were given the opportunity to demonstrate how to use the fire extinguishers effectively.



SOLAR WATER HEATER FOR THE RESIDENTS



The Department of Medical Records at Christian Medical College Hospital in Vellore, led by Dr. Jennifer, donated a 200-litre solar water heater for the benefit of children and grandmothers. The inauguration event was attended by several dignitaries, including General Superintendent Mr. Reni Charles, who is also the Vice-Chairman of the MBKG Pannai Board; Honorary Treasurer Mr. Paul Chandrakumar, Honorary Secretary Mrs. Prema Davis; and Dr. B. Selvamani, the Associate Director of Finance at CMCH and the Correspondent of King's School.



Followed by prayer of thanksgiving, Dr. B. Selvamani cut the ribbon to inaugurate the water heater officially. The residents were overjoyed and showed their gratitude with a loud applause. MBKG Pannai thanks the MRD, CMCH for its generous gift.

Proposal for Improvements to Living Quarters and Facilities for Children / Elders: Estimated Costs:

- **Whitewashing and Painting of Living Quarters:** Rs. 20,00,000
 - Each Cottage - Rs. 1,00,000 (8 Cottages)
 - Nursery Block – Rs. 2,50,000
 - Boys' Home – Rs. 1,30,000
- **Ceiling Fans for Children's and Grandmothers' rooms – 20**
 - The Cost of one ceiling fan is Rs. 1,750
- **Natural Korai Grass Sleeping Mats (3'X6') – 50**
 - The Cost of each mat is Rs. 200
- **Hawaii Slippers (Flip Flops) for the children – 150**
 - A pair of slippers costs between Rs. 80 and Rs.120
- **Copier Machine and Photo Printer for Office:** Rs. 1,25,000
- **Submersible Motor with Pump for Children's Quarters:**
 - Estimated Cost Rs. 1,20,000
- **Rechargeable Emergency Lights for the living quarters of Children and elders – 15 (Cost between Rs. 800 and Rs.1,200)**
